**OPEN CLASSES (1-11) - OPEN TO ALL  
(not just Burley residents & BGA members)**

1	A vase of cottage garden flowers *See Regulation 5
2	Three stems of one perennial flower e.g. Chrysanthemums, Delphiniums, Roses, etc
3	Flowers in an unusual container
4	One stem of one flower with one kind of vegetable
5	A single Pelargonium/Geranium OR Fuchsia in a pot *See Regulation 5
6	Six vegetables - two of each variety - to fit in an area 30cm/12in x the depth of table (approximately 76cm/2ft 6in)

**OPEN CLASSES - HANDICRAFT**

7	A photograph - 'Buildings Old and New' (max. 20cm x 15cm/8in x 6in)
8	A photograph - 'The Great Outdoors' (max. 20cm x 15cm/8in x 6in)
9	A hand knitted OR crocheted item, to fit (folded OR unfolded) in an area 50cm x 50cm/20in x 20in
10	A patchwork OR quilted item to fit (folded OR unfolded) in an area 50cm x 50cm/20in x 20in
11	Any other handcrafted item to fit (folded OR unfolded) in an area 50cm x 50cm/20in x 20in

**CLASSES 12 - 49**

**ONLY OPEN TO BURLEY, BURLEY WOODHEAD RESIDENTS and BGA MEMBERS**

**FRUIT and VEGETABLE CLASSES**

12	A dish of four apples - any variety
13	A dish of fruit - any variety (not apples)
14	Six Dwarf/French beans
15	Six runner beans
16	Three tomatoes (not cherry)
17	A dish of six cherry tomatoes
18	Three onions - red OR white - trimmed
19	Six shallots - culinary OR pickling
20	One cucumber
21	Three root vegetables - all same variety, tops trimmed to 8cm/3in
22	A jam jar of mixed herbs
23	One vegetable not specified in any other class, maximum six specimens
24	Three courgettes - not more than 15cm/6in
25	Five potatoes - all same variety
26	Three garlic bulbs - tops and roots trimmed
27	One head of lettuce in a jam jar of water (roots washed)
28	A disaster!

## FLOWER CLASSES

29	Six pansies OR violas *See Regulation 5
30	Three stems of flowers of one kind, not classified elsewhere
31	One stem specimen hybrid tea rose
32	A vase of three dahlias - of any variety OR varieties
33	A vase of six annuals of one kind (sweet peas, marigolds, zinnia, antirrhinum, etc)
34	A pot of orchids
35	One flowering pot plant (excluding fuchsias, pelargoniums/geraniums, orchids) *See Regulation 5
36	One foliage pot plant (including grasses) *See Regulation 5
37	One pot cactus OR succulent *See Regulation 5
38	One pot plant (provided at Burley Gardeners' Association AGM in April 2024)

## PRODUCE CLASSES (must be homemade)

39	A Victoria sandwich (raspberry jam filling; caster sugar topping; three egg mixture baked in two tins)
40	Bread - A loaf of bread made in the traditional way (not machine made)
41	A chocolate cake - your own recipe, presented with a copy of the recipe
42	A lemon drizzle cake - your own recipe, presented with a copy of the recipe
43	A fruit pie, maximum 23cm/9in
44	Four scones - sweet OR savoury
45	Six biscuits
46	Four pieces of brownie
47	One jar of jam (any fruit) (presented with wax disc & cellophane cover, labelled with fruit type & date made)
48	Four decorated cupcakes
49	One jar of chutney (tomato, plum, etc.) OR pickle (onions, beetroot, piccalilli etc.)

## OPEN JUNIOR CLASSES (50 - 56)

**Age, not name, shown next to exhibit. Must be child's own.**

## Regulations 2024

1	Entries must be individual and are to be submitted, with completed entry forms at the Show Office, on MONDAY, 26th AUGUST, between 10.00am and 12 noon. All exhibits are to be staged before 12.15pm.
2	All exhibits are at the sole risk of the owner.
3	The Judges are empowered to withhold First, or any other Prize from any exhibit not deemed worthy of the award, or from an entry submitted in the wrong class.
4	Exhibitors must be residents of Burley or Burley Woodhead, or are current BGA members, except for Open classes and Junior classes which are open to ANYONE from ANYWHERE!
5	Vases are provided for Flower Classes. All exhibits should be staged in these, except in the starred classes where own vases/pots can be used.
6	No exhibit is to be removed before 4.15pm.
7	In the Fruit, Flower and Vegetable Classes all exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor and must not have won a prize previously at a Burley Show.
8	All entries must be submitted with ENTRY FEES: Exhibitors may have up to two entries in each class. Adults 40p per entry; Junior classes (16 and under) 10p per entry.
9	All exhibits in the Produce, Handicraft and Junior Classes must have been made by the exhibitor and must not have won a prize previously at a Show.
10	Prize money is to be collected from 4.00pm from the Show Office. Money not collected by 5.00pm will be deemed to have been donated to Show Funds.
11	The Committee shall be empowered to settle any dispute which may arise and for which these regulations do not provide.
